Your Vicar

This week marks the beginning of Advent. This might sound a bit strange; after all your advent calendars don't start until 1/12. However unlike mince pies in September and festive trees in November, this is not the church trying to start Christmas early!

The word 'Advent' actually means the appearance or arrival of a particular thing, for example, we regularly say 'the advent of TV...' to mean when we started developing square eyes. The church-ey meaning is actually close to this sense as the church reflects and thinks about preparation for the arrival of Jesus. Not in the first coming of Jesus that we celebrate every Christmas but in the future return of Jesus to bring life and judgement. This can be a hard topic to discuss in public and some people find it all a bit baffling or even embarrassing. But this is a shame because Advent reminds us that Christianity is a forward-looking religion of hope; for new stories, new beginnings that burst out from the most surprising places at surprising times. That change is possible even in the darkest of times. If you're struggling today; there is hope.

One of my own small stories of hope was when my Mum first joined a church here in Taunton. In 1994, Dad was retraining and so it was a lean Christmas on the wage of an apprentice plumber. We didn't ask for anything but I remember watching down the hallway of our house in South Street as envelopes kept popping through the door as people gave us gift

after gift. In fact, we were given so much that we had enough to give £100 to our neighbour, literally 'filled to overflowing'. They gave us cash but the real gift was hope. Not one of us expected it.

I don't know everyone who reads this but whatever big challenges you're facing; there is hope. I can't promise you that 'hope delivered' looks like cash through the letterbox (!), but I know there is hope even in the darkest of nights.


St George's **News**

Our Collections for the rest of November will be donated to 'Corrymeela' - a Christian organisation working for peace and reconcilliation.

Corrymeela was founded in 1965 by Ray Davey, a former Chaplain during World War Two, together with a group of students, who believed that people could learn to live and work together. The organisation has over 50 years of experience working alongside fractured communities and groups. Youth and school groups, family and community organisations, faith communities and political parties are some who have benefitted from their help.

There is a Residential Centre on the north coast of Ireland which hosts over 11,000 people a year, as well as a lived community of volunteers and staff - and also a dispersed community of 150 members who commit to living out Corrymeela's principles of reconcilliation in their own communities.

They seek to support their work of peace and reconcilliation.
