

A Note From **Your Vicar**

This week we visited Wildside Experience with the Mossy Church Team. It's a wonderful place nestled deep within the Blackdown hills with miniature ponies, sheep and pigs led by a smashing couple who felt called by God to offer retreats for churches and schools to help people connect with the creator and the natural world.

It was an exciting day out for St Georges as 45 people of all ages gathered to explore, meet new people and pray. There are lots of activities throughout the woodland including a zipline, wobbly bridges and a 'nightline'. In this last activity, you hold onto a rope and close your eyes using only your senses to guide you along the path through the woodland. You have to keep your hands outstretched otherwise you will bash your head and also move your feet forward slowly so you do not trip up. The bible says 'we walk by faith not by sight' but rarely is it so literal!

One of the things that struck me was the different speeds that we were able to move forward. At the beginning, I kept catching up with the child in front of me; but after a couple of minutes the children had zoomed ahead. Whether they were cheekily opening their eyes I could not possibly comment (I am rather competitive...) but it struck me that children are so much better at walking by faith than adults. Jesus says, 'you must become like children to enter the kingdom'.

Adults can sometimes be more afraid of things than children and it is a sad thought that becoming 'grown up' can mean becoming progressively more

afraid of things. Jesus seems to propose a reverse 'adulting' where instead of getting more afraid, we step more into the abundant life of faith he offers.






Thanks to those who kindly donated and to all of you for your love and prayers.




An Invitation to Rev'd Martin Kirkbride's Licencing Service as Team Rector

We joined in with the joy of creation this week at our songs & have a story in the meadow. Summer event - 'Mossy Church on the Wildside'. Up on the Blackdown Hills in the beautiful sunshine the Mossy Church team were joined by lots of families to 'explore, engage and connect' together in God's wonderful creation. Our morning was led by our brilliant hosts, Richard & Alison who run 'Wildside Experiences'.

Our morning began with drinks by the campfire under a huge parachute tent. A stomp through the fields took us to feed the chickens, meet the pigs & pet the miniature shetland ponies. We learnt about what is involved in keeping animals, how they grow and what they eat. Our adventure then continued up through a field with a flock of sheep and into the woods.

We split into different groups for a variety of activities based on the children's ages. Our 'mini' (0-4's) adventurers, along with our mascot George Bear, got to spend more time with the animals, hunt for minibeasts, go on a sound scavenger hunt, sing some

Our older children got to play hide and seek, take part in a scavenger hunt, do some sensory rope trails and best of all have a go on the zip wire (along with some of the grown ups too!). We finished up, tired and happy with a picnic around the campfire. It was fantastic fun.

If you weren't able to join us this time, don't worry, we have lots of exciting things coming up this next term, including a return to Wildside soon.

Missions to Seafarers.

Day and night, for 365 days a year, Missions to Seafarers is on call providing help and support for seafarers in over 200 ports around the world.

Over 90% of world trade is carried by sea, providing work to 1.5 million seafarers. However, it is also one of the world's most dangerous occupations, with piracy, shipwreck and abandonment just some of the threats that seafarers face.

Chaplains provide support and help at Seafarers' Centres in Port and make Ship visits, offering chaplaincy services to people who are often many months away from homes and families.

The provision of mobile phone facilities to contact families the other side of the world is a much appreciated practical service in recent years, which helps to keep family ties strong and boost morale amongst seafarers.


