
At this pioneering time, we're encouraging people to 'taste and see' whether a small group works but if not then let's try something else!

If we are able, we need to make a special effort to help this year as, like all the charities, it has been so difficult for them to raise the funds they need as no events can be held. If you saw on the TV News the map of the world showing the areas where vaccines have been given - and NOT given - you will know just how blessed WE are.

They are working with like-minded groups to advocate on the importance of ensuring that vaccines are made available to vulnerable people in poor countries and not monopolised by the global North. And when vaccination campaigns begin, Christian Aid will support them by:

- equipping local health services with data on hard-to-reach communities
- mobilising communities to come forward for vaccinations
- working with faith and community leaders to share positive messages about vaccines. Imagine trying to live and work a socially distanced life in some of the countries where CHRISTIAN AID is working. They need our support to continue their work.
