## Your Vicar

What makes a community 'Christian' or not? Ultimately, it's the presence of God, but sometimes people imagine it's a place where nobody disagrees or has different opinions. But God doesn't make uniform robots. So peace is not the absence of conflict but the presence of justice, truth and grace in the whole community. This is a bit heavier than I normally attempt in a News Board piece. This is because at last week's APCM, I shared some difficult news which needs a wider audience than the few that were present at the meeting.


During my predecessor's tenure in the interregnum and now I've arrived, my team has received some critical letters which were not signed. Generally these letters address some of the choices (for example of music, and forms of address) we've made in the services and work of the church. I like getting constructive feedback; it helps, tells me that people care, grows community and makes us stronger. As the new Vicar here, I want to build a culture and life that invites conversation, thought and prayer. But the difficulty of unsigned letters is that dialogue is impossible; there is no right of reply. I actually believe the author(s?) want to contribute and have gifts to bring, but I must say that these letters do not contribute to our life together, but only wound and sap energy.

In Matthew 18, Jesus gives a pattern of dealing with conflict: - speak with the person, if they refuse, take someone with you to discuss the matter, but if there is still disagreement involve the leadership of the church. This is to be the pattern for our community, and so in future any unsigned letters will be not be read but will be shredded on receipt. If you feel nervous talking with me, please talk with the Churchwardens, Bethan or another member of the PCC to help; we want to hear your perspective.

I am praying for my friends who wish to remain unknown.


