This last Monday was 'Freedom Day'. Historic speeches with flags and statues were planned but, on the day, it fell a bit flat as our leaders refused to self-isolate and then caved to pressure to isolate within the time it takes for England to lose a football match.


Freedom is an interesting word because it always implies some kind of captivity followed by some release. The clear 'lockdown' requirements that legally shuttered society have been removed and we are now called to step into the light of our newfound freedom. But rather like turning on the bathroom light in the middle of the night, this light is rather harsh on the eyes. We are now expected to take responsibility with our freedom rather than others. What to do?

At the very beginning of Christianity, one of the major issues was whether it was legitimate for Christians to eat meat offered to idols. Some felt it was fine; others that it was sacrilegious. St Paul wrote; 'Take care that your liberty does not become a stumbling block to others'. Eating meat offered to idols is not a major consideration for many of us...yet here is a principle about how to use our newfound 'freedom'. Not to convince, push or pull others to our own position but to make things possible for others. I've been in situations where people have insisted on or even blanked me when I have not pursued a handshake. This is plain awkward, but these smaller matters do not need to cause us division; if you need to wear a mask, so someone else can feel comfortable, it is a minor inconvenience. This won't go on forever. The value of our relationships and community is more valuable than 'being right' or 'getting my way'.

Blessed are the peacemakers.

riding, sailing, motor sport, performing arts and baking.


They have holiday clubs and other activities on parks, beaches and in community centres around England and Wales.


